**Biographical Note:**

Dr. E. N. Kibler was born in Prosperity, South Carolina on March 16, 1871. He graduated from Emory University in 1892 at which time he was licensed to practice dentistry in South Carolina. That same year he became a member of the South Carolina State Dental Association for which he served as the corresponding secretary (1905) and president (1909-1910). He served several terms in the South Carolina House of Representatives (1920-1932) and as mayor of Prosperity for eight terms between 1906 and 1938. He died November 8, 1960 and is buried in Prosperity.

**Scope and Content Note:**

The E.N. Kibler Papers consist of two undated, handwritten statements pertaining to dentistry. The first is a report, presumably presented to the South Carolina Dental Association, for which Dr. Kibler served as the corresponding secretary, on the topic of gold as the most suitable material for filling teeth. The second is a statement about tooth anatomy, health, decay and treatment.
