Biographical Sketch

Curry, Hiram B. (1927), was born in Midville, Georgia on September 19, 1927, but spent his youth in Jasper, Florida. He earned a B.S. with Medicine Degree from the College of Charleston in 1946 and received his M.D. from the Medical College of South Carolina (MCSC) in 1950. He spent the next thirteen years completing internships and residencies at the Philadelphia General Hospital, Virginia Hospital (Chief Hospital), Medical College Hospital (Neurology), University of Lund (Research Fellow), Massachusetts General Hospital, and Harvard Medical School (Teaching Fellowship).

Dr. Curry spent seven years in his hometown of Jasper as a general practitioner. After bringing in several partners to the business he left to pursue a teaching career, eventually joining the Neurology Faculty of the Medical College of South Carolina in 1963. He established a laboratory for studying cortical and cerebral blood flow, centering on cerebrovascular disease and headache, while simultaneously holding a position as a teacher of family medicine.

In 1969 Dr. Curry helped to design a family practice academic program at MUSC to prepare physicians for a career as a family doctor. This was only the third department of its kind in the United States. The program was expanded to the rest of South Carolina with seven affiliated Family Resident Programs. Curry held his position of Professor and Chairman of the Department of Family Practice until his death in 1989.

Dr. Curry held membership in fifteen professional organizations on the local, state, national, and international level, including the American Medical Association, South Carolina Medical Association, Society of Teachers of Family Medicine, and the International Center for Family Medicine. In honor of his contributions to family practice Dr. Curry was awarded the Outstanding Medical Educator Award by the American

Academy of Family Physicians, the Meritorious Service Medal by the U.S. Army Reserves Medical Corps, and the Certificate for Excellence by the Society of Teachers of Family Medicine.

Scope and Content

The Hiram B. Curry, M.D. Papers, 1961-1988, document Dr. Curry's professional activities. The collection is arranged in four series: (1) Professional Meetings, (2) Publications, (3) Research, and (4) Miscellaneous. The bulk of the materials are documents that concern conferences and lectures in the fields of family practice and neurology. Record types include correspondence, memoranda, articles, news clippings, reprints, manuscripts, handwritten notes, lectures and speeches, grant applications, overhead slides, reports and press releases. Many of Curry's professional meetings on family practice regard behavioral science study, ethics of the family physician, and whether to be concerned about a shortage of family physicians. In the neurology field, Curry often talked about stroke examination and headaches. Research records pertain to Curry's extensive research on headaches, including the various kinds and treatments for each. Publications consist of journal articles that Curry either contributed to somehow or authored entirely. Curry also kept several binders of notes and talks given by him or his colleague C.M. Fisher.

Series Descriptions

Series 1: The **Professional Meetings Series**, 1970-1988, 5 cubic feet, consists of conferences and meetings that Dr. Curry attended in the latter part of his career. Many of the conferences that Curry attended pertained to his work in the family practice field, advocating the need for its specialty. Curry gave 133 invitational addresses in nineteen foreign countries on six continents, of which are included in this series. Curry also presented several lectures on headache and cerebrovascular disease. Other files include Curry's notes on his six-month sabbatical, notes from professional associate meetings, and overseas documentations. Other record types include writings and papers, lecture notes, conference and travel memorabilia, correspondence, and reprints. The series is arranged in chronological order.

Series 2: The **Publications Series**, 1961-1988, 1 cubic feet, consists of journal articles that Dr. Curry authored entirely, collaborated on, or was used as a source. The publications range from writings on family practice to neurology to neck and back pain. Included in this series is one of Curry's most famous articles, "Phoenix in Flight: All Systems Go," which detailed his justification for the family practice field. Other record types include drafts and handwritten notes. This series is arranged in chronological order and then alphabetically.

Series 3: The **Research Series**, 1963-1988, 2 cubic feet, consists of Dr. Curry's research on headaches. Dr. Curry had files on a range of topics concerning headaches, including specific types, such as cluster headaches and tension headaches. These files include materials he used in his lectures on headaches, as well as journal articles, pamphlets, and

notes to supplement them. Other record types include correspondence, handwritten notes, memoranda and overhead slides. This series is arranged in a topical, alphabetical order.

Series 4: The Miscellaneous Series, 1956-undated, 1 cubic feet, consists of Dr. Curry's binders that include many of his lectures and notes. There are also two binders that hold the papers of C.M. Fisher that Dr. Curry appeared to have used in his research. There are several files that consist of other miscellaneous lecture supplies, including overheads and talking notes. Other record types include memoranda, correspondence, articles, reprints and handwritten notes. This series is arranged alphabetically.
